He brings many years of grass farming experience to the table. His ideas about drying hay in the bale deserve your time and attention. Dwight Stoltzfoos, with 15 year's experience in managing Springwood Dairy, will make some observations about "why calf raising and how you do it?" is one of the most important questions on your farm. What are the results of those decisions? How can I extend my grazing into the deep of Winter? These and other questions like; "why would I plant trees in my open pastures?" will be entertained.
